Rothenburg ob der Tauber is a town in Middlefranken in Bavaria. This ancient, well known town was a free Imperial City from the Middle Ages to 1803, and has a long interesting history. In the past it was a town of pilgrimage and was involved in the Thirty Years War. Because the town represented all that was quintessentially German, it was a focal point of the Nazis before and during the Second World War.
